1. Collaboration between administrators, staff, parents, community members, and Board of Trustees to increase excellence at Runge High School.
2. Principal and Counselor had freedom to create a master schedule that includes a morning zero period for tutorials and two brunch periods for students.
3. Counselor plans and conducts parent meetings with grade level groups and with parent and student to focus on developing the 4-year plan, graduation, and postsecondary readiness.
4. Committed staff who care about the students and commit to providing more critical thinking for the success of our students.
5. Use of technology for administrative procedures, instructional support, and research. **Three computer labs available for students.**
6. Highly Qualified teachers—experienced in their teaching field.
7. **For 2013-14 added a jr high reading teacher.**
8. Continuing to learn/implement best practices by studying data from previous tests to help improve overall performance.
9. **Attending staff development to improve curriculum and instructional strategies.**

VI. Comprehensive Needs Assessment for AYP Data Analysis

- CHALLENGES

1. Reading and Math interventions.
2. Studying data to continuously individualize tutorials for students.
3. Providing staff development to stay current with changes in the state testing program and graduation requirements.
4. Insuring all students are being taught at a higher level with depth and complexity.
5. Insuring all students are mastering TAKS/STAAR/EOC at high levels and that all students are making “adequate yearly progress.”
6. Parent participation across all student groups and grade levels.
