Our Family Engagement Plan, available on the district website, serves as a cornerstone for collaborative partnerships, promoting a child-centered, age-appropriate, and family-driven culture of learning.

Key Objectives

Facilitate Family-to-Family Support:

- Meet and Greet" Session: Teachers host informal "Meet and Greet" in conjunction with Save the Children allowing parents to connect.
- Daily Communication: Teachers share daily updates directly with parents through a user-friendly phone app and take-home folders.
- Online Information Hub: Utilizing district websites, campus administration and teachers ensure easy access to important information for families.
- Engaging Events: Campus administration, teachers, and ACE afterschool programs organize and host monthly family and community events.

Establish a Network of Community Resources:

- Community Collaboration: The school collaborates with community organizations such as the Runge Chamber of Commerce, Marathon Oil, Circle of Angels, and area churches to provide essential services.
- Liaison/Nurse/Counselor Support: A dedicated team facilitates access to necessary community resources for families.
- Health Education: The school nurse provides valuable information to families, including vaccination and lice prevention education.
- Enrichment Opportunities: Teachers and school personnel offer enrichment opportunities in partnership with organizations like the Chamber of Commerce and Marathon Oil.

Increase Family Participation in Decision Making:

- Parent-Teacher Organization Involvement: Prekindergarten families are actively included in the Parent Teacher Organization.
- Volunteer Opportunities: Families are encouraged to volunteer, fostering a sense of community and shared responsibility.
- Parental Insights: The campus provides a questionnaire, allowing teachers to understand children from their parents' perspective and initiate support services as needed.

Equip Families with Tools for Learning:

• Conference Instruction: Teachers provide families with practical tips for authentic learning during conferences.

• Evening Learning Events: Teachers host evening learning events, providing free books to families to kickstart home libraries and promote literacy.
